This workshop is devoted to improving participants' research skills of publishing internationally in academic outlets. It will start with a general discussion on what makes a successful academic career and what role publishing plays in building academic career. The workshop combines presentation and discussions of critical issues a researcher encounters in developing a research idea, writing it up, submitting an article to the peer review process in international journals, revising papers, and ensuring high quality contribution and impact. It will also cover effective publishing strategies for early career academics. The discussions will include concrete examples from research practice, focusing on international journal publications. The participants will developed their own personalized publication strategy.

She holds PhD from Center for Higher Education Policy Studies (CHEPS), University of Twente. Her postdoctoral research was carried out at Harvard University, the Minda de Gunzburg Center for European Studies. Prof. Leisyte is an editorial board member of Higher Education Policy, Social Inclusion, Triple Helix, Learning Organisation and Acta Pedagogica Vilnensis. Prof. Leisyte is a co-convener of the Higher Education section of the European Educational Research Association as well as a former board member of the German Higher Education Research Association and Futura Scientia. She has published five books, numerous book chapters and articles on organizational change in universities and academic work.

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
