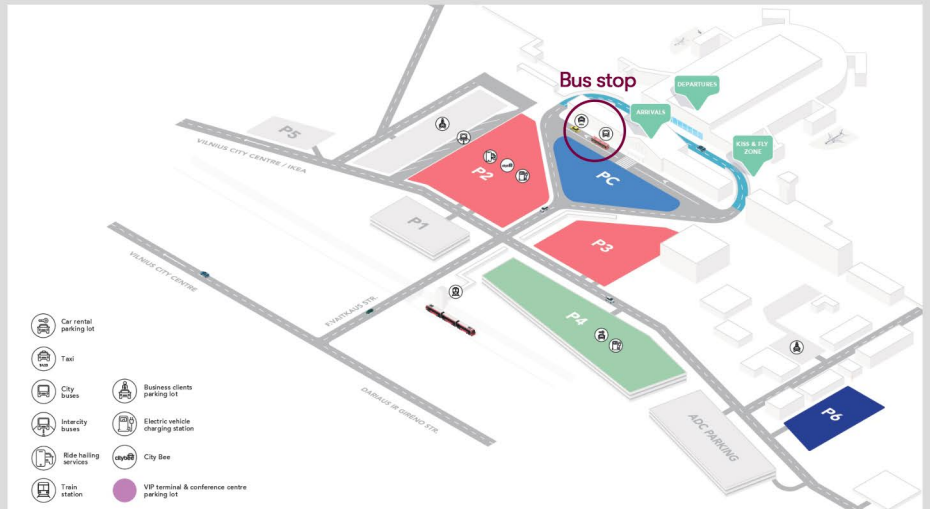

# HOW TO GET FROM VILNIUS AIRPORT TO CITY CENTER

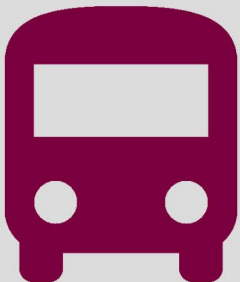
## Purchasing public transport tickets:

Most convenient (and cheaper) way is to download the **Trafi** app which lets you pay by card (more about the app below).

Single-ride tickets can also be bought from the bus driver for 1 Euro (ticket is valid for one trip, cash only). A ticket is only valid if marked on the bus. Keep in mind, that *if you are carrying big luggage, you need to buy a second ticket for it.*

## BY BUS (PUBLIC TRANSPORT):

Buses are a convenient way of getting around with plenty of apps showing bus stop locations and timetables (like Google Maps or Trafi). You can also find physical timetables at bus stops or on the website [www.stops.lt](http://www.stops.lt)

The bus stop **Oro uostas (Airport)** is next to Arrivals terminal A and B. To get to city center we recommend taking **88 bus** and getting off at the **Vinco Kudirkos aikštė stop**. From there it takes ~8 minutes by foot to get to the faculty.

Other available buses which drive through center: **3G, 1, 2, 88, 88N\*** (night bus).



## BY TAXI:

You can also take a taxi to and from the airport. If you are at the airport, you can catch a cab from the taxi rank outside the airport but be aware – they tend to over-charge. If you do choose to take one of these taxis, ask for a receipt, and if it's more than what the Vilnius Airport's guide indicates you should pay, you can follow up for a refund.

We recommend that you use one of the apps available to hail a cab 24/7. Try **Bolt**, **eTaksi** or **Forus** (book online with these services or download one of the apps.)

# GETTING AROUND VILNIUS

## By foot

Getting around Vilnius on foot is the preferred method for most short-term visitors. Vilnius is a small city, and visitors often end up staying in and exploring the Old Town (which is also where our faculty is located).

## By bus or trolleybus

The city's bus and trolleybus network offers excellent coverage throughout the city. You can check suggested apps or websites like [stops.lt](https://stops.lt) or [vilniustransport.lt](https://vilniustransport.lt) for routes and times.

## By taxi

Taxis in Vilnius are affordable and safe. These days, apps make it easy to book a taxi without having communication issues get in the way. Try **Bolt**, **eTaksi** or **Forus** if you don't mind downloading an app. These services offer the benefit of linking your card to the app, meaning the cost of your ride is deducted automatically via your card. Also you can use **Taxi.lt** for online booking.

## By car / bike / scooter-sharing service

Both **CityBee** and **Spark** car-sharing services are an option for getting around Vilnius. CityBee cars are easily found parked throughout the city and with the app, you can identify the one closest to you. Spark is an electric car-sharing service alternative.

If the weather permits, you can use **Bolt** electric scooters (rent on Bolt app) or **Cyclocity** bikes.

## Suggested apps

**Trafi:** covers your public transportation needs in various ways by allowing you to buy tickets for buses, offering traffic information, and showing you where bikes or cars can be rented.

**Bolt:** taxi service and electric scooter rental service.

**eTaksi:** taxi service.

**Forus:** taxi service.

**Taxi.lt:** taxi service (can book without an app).

**Cyclocity:** bike rental service; rent bikes from Cyclocity docking bays all around the city.

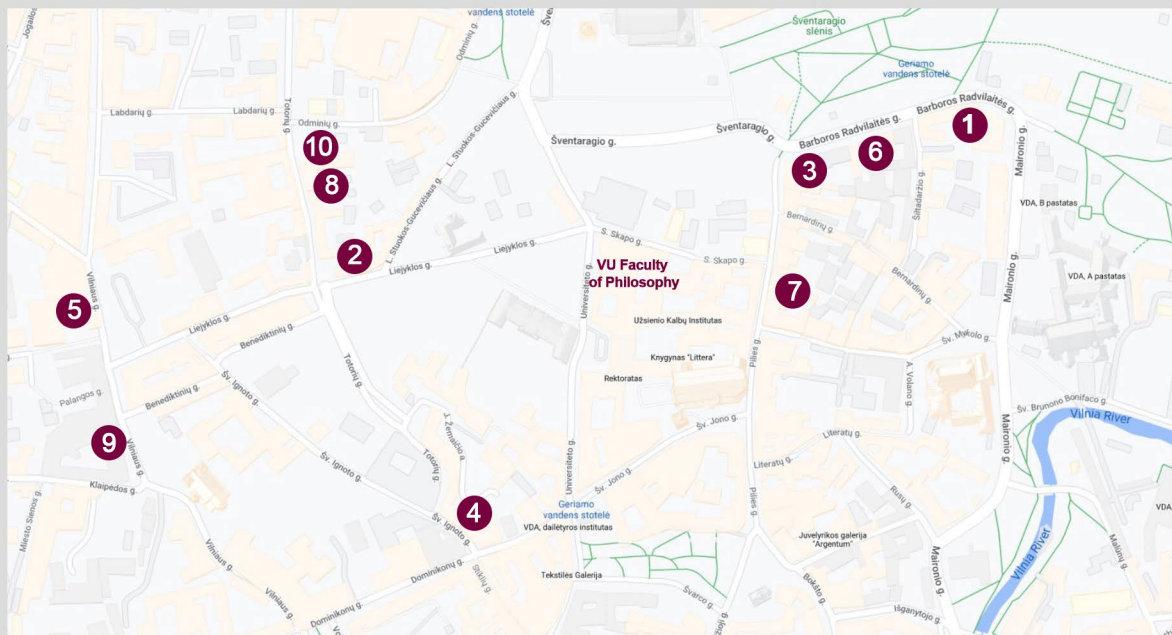
**CityBee:** car-sharing service.
