



Tomasz Mróz (born in 1975) is a Polish historian of philosophy, focusing on the history of Polish philosophical tradition and on the modern reception of ancient philosophy, esp. Plato. He received Ph.D. from the University of Zielona Góra (2004), and postdoctoral degree (habilitation) from the University of Silesia (2014). Since 2000 T. Mróz continues lecturing at the University of Zielona Góra.

His research was supported by The Ministry of Science (2008-2011), Congregatio Resurrectionis (2013: Kraków), Bednarowski Trust (2014: University of St Andrews), Kosciuszko Foundation (2015: University of Iowa), Lanckoronski de Brzezie Foundation (2016: Cambridge).

T. Mróz is the author of three books in Polish (*Wincenty Lutosławski – Polish Studies on Plato*, Zielona Góra 2003; *Wincenty Lutosławski: I am the Citizen of Utopia*, Krakow 2008; *Plato in Poland 1800-1950. Types of Reception – Authors – Problems*, Kęty 2012) and more than 70 papers (in Polish and English) as well as an editor of several books.

Twice (2013, 2015) he received Erasmus Teaching Staff Mobility Grant and delivered series of lectures at the Faculty of Philosophy of Vilnius University. T. Mróz actively collaborates with the journal "Problemos" published by Vilnius University.
