Recent project activities

ToT courses in SCL (WP 2)

In collaboration with the School of Electrical Engineering and Informatics <u>Institut</u> <u>Teknologi Bandung</u> (STEI ITB), EASTEM ITB conducted a series of online workshops with ITB lecturers. Topics included "Utilising ITB Learning Management System for Online Lecture" (30 July) and "Student-centered Learning (SCL) Implementation on STEM Online Learning" (14 August).

Management (WP 7)

Following the submission of the project midterm report in July, UU has received additional financing from the EU Commission and started the process of budget transfers to all partners having submitted all required reporting documents.
